The School Board of Sarasota Co	unty, Florida (th	e "Board").

Purpose: Provide research-based, age-appropriate programs to school age girls throughout Sarasota County after school.

USF agrees to:

1. Provide the following research-based programs:

Girls on the Run®

Girls on the Run is a transformational physical-activity-based positive youth development program for girls in 3rd-8th grade. We teach life skills through dynamic, interactive lessons and running games. The program culminates with the girls being physically and emotionally prepared to complete a celebratory 5k running event. The goal of the program is to unleash confidence through accomplishment while establishing a lifetime appreciation of health and fitness. Topics include self-esteem, body image, bullying, gossip, conflict resolution, substance abuse prevention, and community service. GOTR includes developmentally appropriate components for girls in grades 3rd-5th (Girls on the Run) and grades 6th-8th (Heart & Sole.) Girls in grades 9th-12th are trained to serve at junior coaches.

- 2. Provide referral to resources in the community and to act as an advocate.
- 3. Provide services to approximately 100 girls including elementary, middle and high school girls.
- 4. Assure that all volunteers, employees or agents who will be present on school grounds will be fingerprinted and have their backgrounds checked as provided by Florida law. USF will furnish the results of all background checks to The Board before any of its volunteers, employees or agents will be permitted on school grounds while students are present. USF will further immediately furnish to The Board any notifications of arrests it receives with respect to volunteers, employees or agents who are present on school grounds. USF will bear the cost of the

fingerprinting/background checks. The Board has the right to refuse entry onto its school grounds to any individual whose background check does not meet the requirements established by The Board pursuant to Florida law. Like other visitors to school grounds, USF volunteers, employees or agents will also be subject to RAPTOR screening on school campuses. Additionally, any mentor must sign in and out of the school district's Volunteers Count! database each time they are on campus to mentor.

- 5. Hold harmless, indemnify, and defend the Board, its agents, servants, employees, in their official and individual capacity, from any demand, claim, suit loss, cost, expense or damage which may be asserted, claimed or recovered against or from the Board, its agents or employees, in their official or individual capacity, by reason of any damage to property or injury or death of any person which arises out of, is incident to, or in any manner connected with this Agreement. This provision shall survive termination of this Agreement and shall be binding on the parties, successors, representatives and assigns and cannot be waived or varied.
 Nothing in this provision is intended to waive any sovereign immunity to which the Board may be entitled.
- Provide a minimum of \$500,000 comprehensive general liability insurance naming the Board as an additional insured. As evidence of such insurance coverage, USF shall furnish The Board with a Certificate of Insurance prior to commencing services under this Agreement.

The School Board agrees to:

- 1. Provide, upon securing appropriate parental consent, access to elementary, middle school and high school girls at Bay Haven Elementary, Emma E Booker Elementary, Gocio Elementary, Tuttle Elementary, Alta Vista Elementary, Brentwood Elementary, Ashton Elementary, Southside Elementary, Phillippi Shores Elementary, Gulf Gate Elementary, Tatum Ridge Elementary, Cranberry Elementary, Atwater Elementary, Glenallen Elementary, Toledo Blade Elementary, Lamarque Elementary, Garden Elementary, Venice Elementary, and Englewood Elementary, Booker Middle, Brookside Middle, McIntosh Middle, Sarasota Middle, Pine View School, Laurel Nokomis School, Heron Creek Middle, Venice Middle, Woodland Middle, Booker High, Sarasota High, Riverview High, Suncoast Polytechnical High, Venice High and North Port High.
- 2. Provide a facility on the each of the above-named campuses to meet with the identified students.
- 3. Provide an avenue for marketing to girls, parents and school staff.

4. Provide, upon securing appropriate parental consent, access to student information, i.e., demographics, schedule, grades, test scores. IEPs, behavior reports and other progress reports and attendance.

Both Parties agree:

- 1. There will be no cost to the Board for USF providing services hereunder.
- 2. That USF is at all times acting and performing as an independent contractor in the performance of all obligations hereunder.
- 3. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida, and sole and exclusive jurisdiction for any action shall be in the Twelfth Judicial Circuit in and for Sarasota County, Florida.
- 4. Any additions, changes, deletions or modifications to this Agreement must be agreed upon in writing by both parties.
- 5. This Agreement shall commence July 1, 2017, and terminate June 30, 2018. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time without cause by giving thirty days written notice to the other party.
