Grant Purpose	The Hovercraft Project is a STEAM project that incorporates leadership, team-building, problem solving, data collection & analysis. It creates a love of learning & intrinsic motivation for students. It reinforces classroom curriculum & gives context for learning. Students learn team-working skills that have real world application & demonstrate the value of each student's role. Regardless of success, they are reminded that failure is simply another opportunity to learn.
Grant Activities	Teachers place students in groups prior to arrival & select team leaders. Team leaders assign different roles to students in groups. Mr. Chase will lead the project. He meets with team leaders, who explain instructions to their group. This culminates in the measuring, cutting & assembly of a low friction vehicle called a hovercraft. Once assembled, 2 students at a time ride the hovercraft, evaluate performance, make changes to optimize performance, & compete in distance competition.
Grant Budget Items	The only cost of the project is \$25 per student that is paid to Chase Educational consulting, NFP. For 148 students the grant is \$3700. No additional costs are associated with this project.
After Grant Plans	Students will be given problems to solve, not solutions. Students are given a context for learning that they must apply for future concepts. Students participate in a large, hands on project, the likes of which they have not seen before. This in turn creates intrinsic
