RE: School Board Workshop, April 16, 2013 -- Capital Budget Options

At its February 19, 2013 Capital Budget Workshop, the School Board asked staff to produce a Five-Year Budget option that included classroom wings to replace portables. This packet contains these materials:

1. A budget spreadsheet for Option A from that workshop

- 2. A spreadsheet for Option B which adds classroom wings for Gocio Elementary and Laurel Nokomis Schools within the five-year plan.
- 3. A table comparing facility, enrollment, and instructional factors for Fruitville Elementary, Gocio, Laurel Nokomis, and Pine View
- 4. A site plan for each campus

When comparing the two budgets, note these items:

- the budgets are identical for the 2013-14 and 2014-15 years,
- in Option B, the cells in blue are new and the cells in green are changed from Option A
  - o Gocio's classroom wing is a two-year \$7 million project beginning in 2015-16; this project is funded by lengthening the Pine View project into the 2018-19 year
  - Laurel Nokomis's classroom wing is also a two-year \$7 million project [NOTE Laurel Nokomis could be done before Gocio]; this project is funded by beginning the Brentwood project a year later
  - o Fruitville's project has been increased by \$2 million in 2016-17 to reflect a more realistic scope of work on that constrained campus
  - Option B also reduces the 2017-18 carry forward by \$4 million.
- the classroom wings at Fruitville, Gocio, and Laurel Nokomis are staggered as each must be funded with Sales Tax revenues.

The exact scope for each classroom wing will be developed a year or so prior to project inception; each preliminary scope at this time includes the following:

• Fruitville – a two-story, 16-20 classroom building to house an Autism center on the first floor [classrooms, observation rooms, motor room, and spaces for behavior specialist, speech therapist, OT/PT, parent conferences, and equipment] and general classrooms on the second floor. The project scope might also address needs for a longer bus loop, for parent and visitor parking, and for improved traffic flow.

- Gocio a two-story building to house 24 general classrooms
- Laurel Nokomis a two-story, 16 classroom building to house an Autism center on the first floor [classrooms, observation rooms, motor room, and spaces for behavior specialist, speech therapist, OT/PT, parent conferences, and equipment] and general classrooms on the second floor. The project scope might also address the need for an elementary music room, for a horticulture lab, and for other large, special use spaces.
- Pine View a two-story building to house 24 classrooms, including a few 21<sup>st</sup> Century middle school science labs.

#### If the projects conform to the above preliminary scopes:

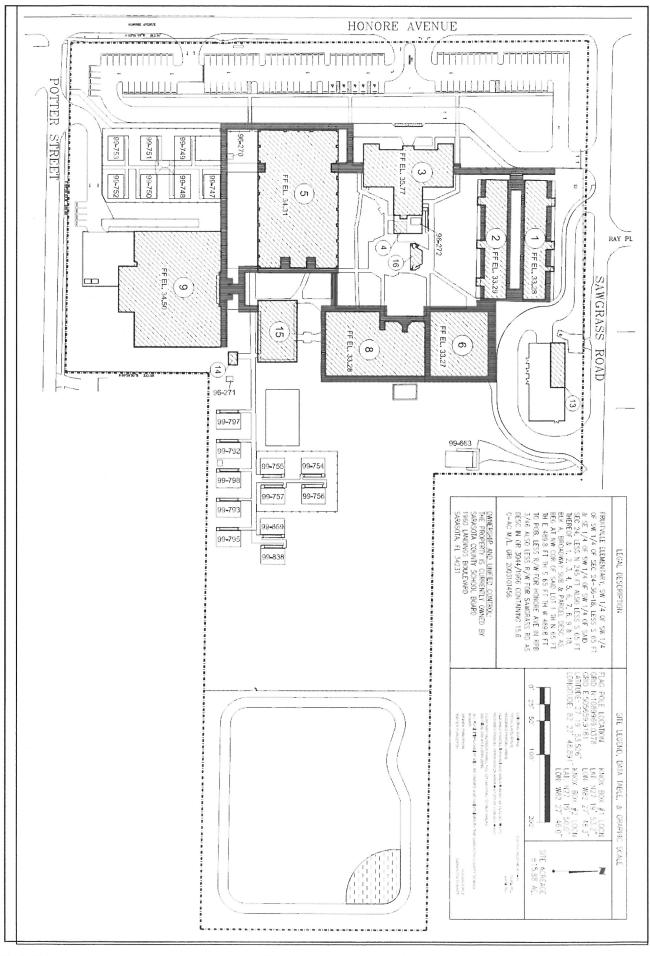
- Fruitville would have no portables, the Autism program would function in an efficient selfcontained setting, traffic flow would be safer, and the school would seem less crowded
- Gocio might still have a few portables, depending on attendance zone and school choice trends
- Laurel Nokomis would have no portables, the Autism program would function in an efficient self-contained setting, and student flow would be more efficient
- Pine View would still have a number of portables, but its oldest units would have been demolished; the HVAC renovation would have been completed but any expansion of core facilities could not occur until Year 6
- Brentwood's cafeteria could be rebuilt -- or its classrooms could be renovated but not both, at least not until Year 6.

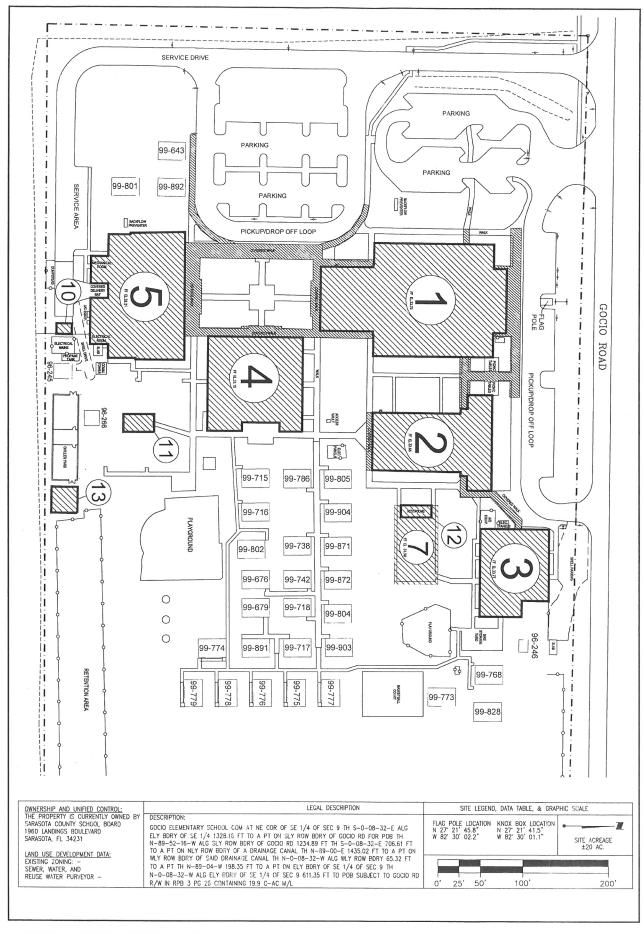

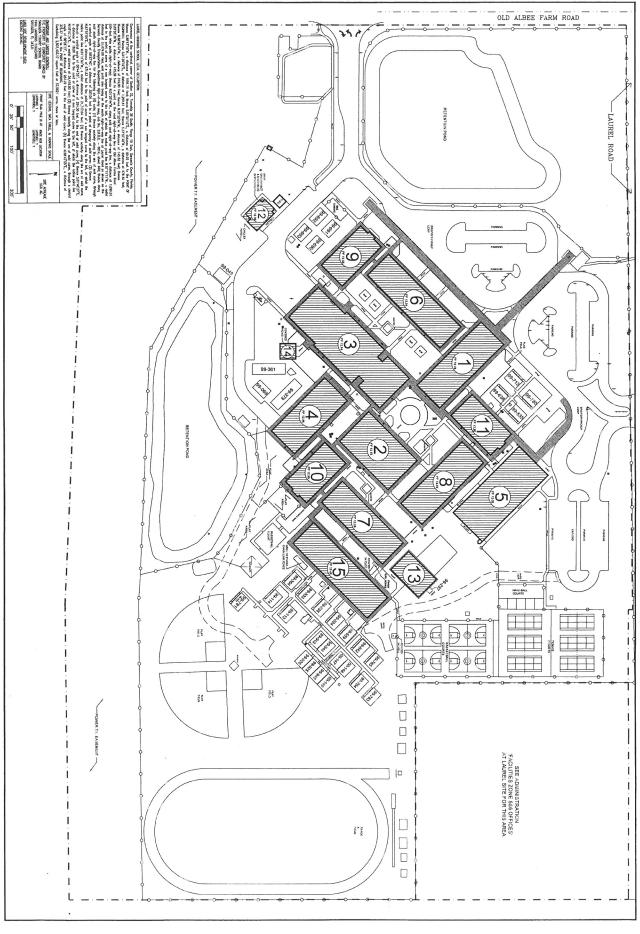

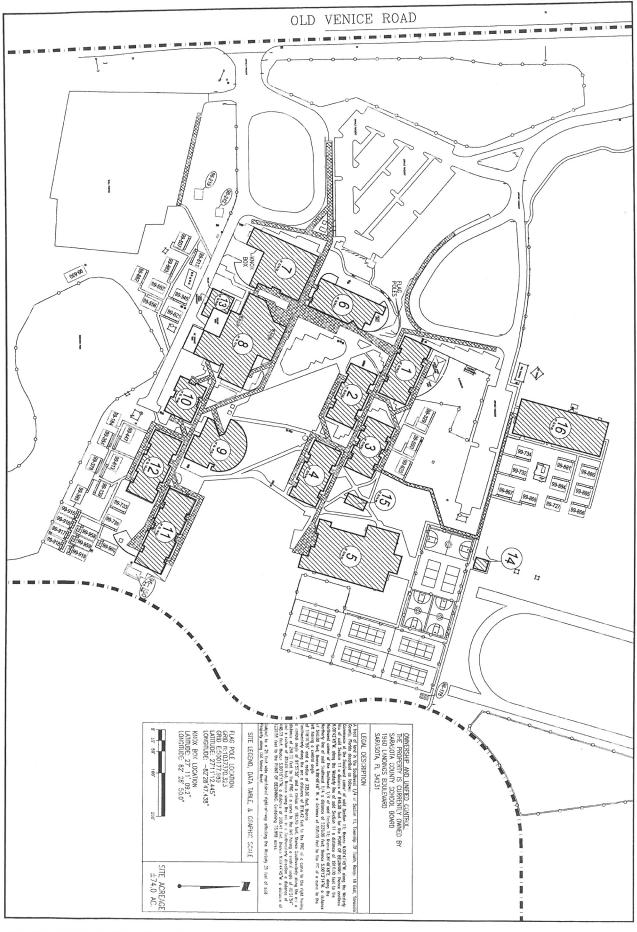
