## Executive Summary

The funding of public education in Florida is a responsibility of the Florida Legislature. The Florida Education Finance Program was established by the Legislature to insure that the funding per student be the same throughout the state. Many of the funding allocations have specific Legislative expenditure requirements. These allocations are called state categorical. In order to be in compliance with the Legislative mandates, staffing formulas are established. These staffing formulas allow auditors to certify the School Board is in compliance with Legislative mandates. In addition to Legislative appropriations, the voters of Sarasota approved supplemental funding. This supplemental funding is used to provide a higher quality instructional program than what the state of Florida provides.

## Personnel Allocation Formulas

The staffing formulas are displayed by area of responsibility in the tables below.
The appropriate Executive Director may authorize a waiver of the formulas.

| Basic Classroom Teachers, Grades 4-5 | For fourth through fifth grades, the ratio is one teacher for every 22 students. The computation is based upon the total enrollment less ESE self-contained students. In the ratio, ESOL and gifted teachers are included. The funding of the positions is a combination of the categorical class size appropriation, discretionary lottery funding, supplemental academic intervention funds, and the Florida Education Finance Program funds. |
| ESE Resource Teachers | The majority of these students are basic general education students. The ESE resource teacher provides supplemental services for the specific ESE needs of the student. The ratio of students per resource teacher is approximately 37 students per teacher. |
| ESE Teachers, Self-Contained | For students with disabilities, other than students identified as emotionally handicapped, autistic, or trainable mentally handicapped, the ratio is 1 teacher for every 13 students, with a teacher's aide. |
| ESE Teachers, Emotionally and Trainable Handicapped | The ratio is 1 teacher for every 8 students, with a teacher's aide. |
| ESE Teachers, Autistic | The ratio is 1 teacher for every 7 students, with a teacher's aide. |

| Extra Duty Days Registrar Services | Four days per school are allocated to Registrars. <br> All extra duty days are funded from the additional voted millage. |
| Extra Duty Days <br> Instructional | 2.8 days per school are allocated to instructional salary schedule staff. All extra duty days are funded from the additional voted millage. |

| Behavior Intervention Teacher | One per school. This position was funded with IDEA Stimulus funds. This position was deleted when Stimulus funds ended. |
| ESE Liaison | ESE Liaisons are allocated to schools based upon the number of students with disabilities, excluding gifted and speech and language students. The ratio is a 6 position allocation for up to 76 students and a full position for over 76 students. |
| ESOL Liaison | ESOL of at least 17 FTE earns a .5 position. All positions are funded from the additional voted millage. |

The funding of the positions is a combination of the categorical class size appropriation, discretionary lottery funding, supplemental academic intervention funds, and the Florida Education Finance Program funds. |
| Intensive Reading Teachers | Students that are level 1 require 90 minute classes with 18 students per class. Each teacher will teach 3 classes per day. Students that are level 2 require 45 minute classes with 18 students per class. Teachers will teach 6 classes per day. These teachers are funded from the state reading categorical. |
| Encore Teachers, including <br> Art, Music, and Physical Education | The teachers required for encore classes are computed as follows: School enrollment less $50 \%$ of levels one and two students, divided by 30 students per class. Each teacher can teach six classes. |
| ESE Resource Teachers | The majority of these students are basic general education students. The ESE resource teacher provides supplemental services for the specific ESE needs of the student. The ratio of students per resource teacher is approximately 37 students per teacher. |
| ESE Teachers, Emotionally and Trainable Handicapped | The ratio is 1 teacher for every 8 students, with a teacher's aide. |
| ESE Teachers, Self-Contained | For students with disabilities, other than students identified as emotionally handicapped, autistic, or trainable mentally handicapped, the ratio is 1 teacher for every 13 students, with a teacher's aide. |
| Gifted Cluster Foreign Language Allocation | Booker Middle and Woodland - a . 6 position each and Sarasota Middle - 1 position. <br> Positions are funded from the additional voted millage. |
| School Specific Instructional Positions | Booker Middle - . 4 Visual Performing Arts Coordinator, Brookside Middle - one International Baccalaureate Coordinator, and Venice Middle - one JROTC instructor. |
| Extra Duty Days Instructional | 26.68 days for instructional salary schedule staff. All extra duty days are funded from the additional voted millage. |

| Intensive Reading Teachers | Students that are level 1 or 2 require 90 minute classes with 20 students per class. Each teacher will teach three classes per day. These teachers are funded from the state reading categorical. |
| Language Arts Teachers | Total school enrollment, less the students that are ESOL and selfcontained exceptional education students; divide by 150 students for each teacher. |
| Math Teachers | Total school enrollment by grade level, less the students that are self-contained exceptional education students. For grades 9 and 10, there are 132 students per teacher. For grade 11, there are 150 students per teacher. For grade 12 , take $40 \%$ of the students and divide by 150 students per teacher. |
| Science Teachers | Total school enrollment by grade level, less the students that are self-contained exceptional education students. For grades 9 through 11 , there are 150 students per teacher. For grade 12 , take $25 \%$ of the students and divide by 150 students per teacher. |
| Social Studies Teacher | Total school enrollment by grade level, less the students that are self-contained exceptional education students. For grades 10 through 12 , there are 150 students per teacher. |
| Physical Education Teacher | The allocation by grade level is $80 \%$ of 9 th grade, 40 students per class. Each teacher teaches 6 classes. For 10th grade, $60 \%$ of the students, 40 per class. Each teacher teaches six classes. For 11th and 12th grades, $40 \%$ of the students, 40 per class. Each teacher teaches six classes. |
| Foreign Language Teacher | Total school enrollment by grade level, less the students that are self-contained exceptional education students. For grades 10 and 11, there are 25 students per class and each teacher teaches six classes. |
| Non Visual Performing Arts Schools: <br> Music, Art, Dance, and Drama Teachers | Total school enrollment, class size of 30 students. Each teacher teaches six classes. |
| Booker High School: Music, Art, Dance, and Drama Teachers | Total school enrollment, less students in the Visual Performing Arts program, multiply by $60 \%$, classes of 30 students. Each teacher teaches six classes. |
| Booker High School: Visual Performing Arts Teachers | Visual Performing Arts student enrollment, 25 students per class. Each teacher teaches six classes. |
| Career and Technical Education Teachers | The career and technical education teachers and the on the job training teachers are allocated in conjunction with the Director of Career and Technical Education. To arrive at the total allocation per school, the career and technical student FTE is divided by 19 FTE. |

Riverview High receives 1 instructional position for the operation of the planetarium and 1 Registrar for the Cyesis program. |
| Security Aides - SSP-4 | The number of Security Aides is determined by the Department of Safety and Security / School Police. |
| Extra Duty Days Office Staff | Ten days per Registrar. <br> All extra duty days are funded from the additional voted millage. |
| Extra Duty Days Instructional | Ten days per Counselor and Behavior Specialist. <br> All extra duty days are funded from the additional voted millage. |
| Extra Duty Days ESOL | Schools that do not earn an ESOL Liaison receive 2.88 extra duty days per ESOL FTE. All extra duty days are funded from the additional voted millage. |

## Other School Formulas

The Sarasota County Technical Education Institute, which serves both high school and adult post-secondary students, receives the state allocation from workforce development funds and the staff positions earned by a high school. The center uses this allocation of funds to staff the necessary positions.
