Executive Summary

The funding of public education in Florida is a responsibility of the Florida Legislature. The Florida Education Finance Program was established by the Legislature to insure that the funding per student be the same throughout the state. Many of the funding allocations have specific Legislative expenditure requirements. These allocations are called state categorical. In order to be in compliance with the Legislative mandates, staffing formulas are established. These staffing formulas allow auditors to certify the School Board is in compliance with Legislative mandates. In addition to Legislative appropriations, the voters of Sarasota approved supplemental funding. This supplemental funding is used to provide a higher quality instructional program than what the state of Florida provides.

Personnel Allocation Formulas

The staffing formulas are displayed by area of responsibility in the tables below. The appropriate Executive Director may authorize a waiver of the formulas.

The Sarasota County Technical Education Institute, which serves both high school and adult post-secondary students, receives the state allocation from workforce development funds and the staff positions earned by a high school. The center uses this allocation of funds to staff the necessary positions.
