Grant Purpose	Peer conflict is an issue of paramount concern at the fourth grade level. This year, more than any other, support staff and administration have received an increased number of reports of verbal and relational bullying. Classroom teachers and parents of students have made the school aware of instances of social exclusion, isolation and name-calling. The principal, Mr. Weida, strongly recommended recommended a teaching artist intervention.
Grant Activities	The teaching artist will conduct her drama-based bullying prevention program with four classes. The four sessions of the residency with each class will include: an introduction to improvisational drama; a session exploring the definition of bullying; a session brainstorming possible feelings resulting from bullying and possible responses from bystanders; and a final session culminating in steps students can take to prevent bullying and resolve peer conflict.
Grant Budget Items	The grant will fund contracted services with teaching artist Hedda Matza-Haughton, LCSW, to provide four four-session classroom-based residencies (includes: the four artist in residency teaching sessions with four classes each, multiple planning meetings with the guidance counselor/ teachers, creation and distribution of materials, including student journal homework assignments, teacher and student evaluations).

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After Grant Plans	The grant activities will be continued by teacher reinforcement, school counselor lessons and behavior staff intervention. The teachers, counselor and staff will utilize concepts and vocabulary provided in the lesson and integrate them into future lessons. Evaluation materials and student written responses during the exploration will be expanded and integrated into lessons on conflict resolution.
