#### **Executive Summary**

The preliminary Capital revenue budget for 2011–2012 has been based upon a five percent reduction in property values, a three percent increase in sales tax revenue, and no student growth. The appropriations are sorted by recurring costs, projects that are in process, and the balance that is available for new projects. The table below displays the current amended budget and the preliminary 2011-2012 budget. The 2011-2012 budget will be increased for contract and purchase order encumbrances that roll forward from the 2010-2011 fiscal year
