Grant Purpose	The Sarasota County School Food Ambassador Program will be based on the National FoodCorps program to build capacity within Sarasota County Schools to bridge the gap between nutrition, agriculture, and the development of healthy food choice behaviors through the implementation of campaigns within K-12 feeder schools. The objective is to increase students' consumption of fruits and vegetables during school meals, with an emphasis on Florida-grown produce.
Grant Activities	Three School Food Ambassadors will be hired to develop and implement healthy school food campaigns in North, Central, and South county schools. Campaigns will include but are not limited to: healthy food marketing, healthy food nudging/customer service, school gardens, county-wide school garden network, and trainings.
Grant Budget Items	The funds will be used to hire three contracted service members to implement the campaigns, purchase garden supplies and marketing materials, and for travel to a required national meeting.
After Grant Plans	The grant project is designed to build capacity within the feeder schools in North, Central, and South county. The campaigns developed will be translatable for further use by teachers, student groups, community partners, internship/externship opportunities, and even other school districts.
