#### E. Duties

# III. Rights and Duties of the School Board

- ⋗ The School District Police Department Chief of Police shall be in the chain of command of the Superintendent and shall have no authority over Sheriff personnel, but may act as a liaison between the Sheriff's Office via the SRD Lieutenant and the School District.

- Access to an air-conditioned and properly lit private office
- 2 A secure location for files and records that can be properly locked and

# IV. Costs and Payment of the School Safety Program

#### A. Cost

The School Board agrees to pay  $\frac{\$1,246.994.00}{100}$  for Sheriff members' salaries, benefits and training for the twelve-month period from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019.

### B. Payment

Funds provided by the School Board during the term of this agreement for the total amount of \$1,246.994.00 for the Sheriff's School Safety Program shall be paid to the Sheriff in 12 equal monthly payments beginning July 1, 2018.
