Organization of 2010 Committee to Review Challenge to state-approved high school textbook, "World History: Patterns of Interaction"

As School Board policy 4.30 (Challenged Materials) stipulates, "the Superintendent shall designate the Instructional Materials Manager as being responsible for the organization of this review committee...

"The following shall serve as a review committee for secondary schools:

- 1. The chairperson of (a) School Advisory Council or designee;
- 2. Secondary media specialist;
- 3. Secondary principal;
- 4. A curriculum supervisor;
- 5. Three (3) instructional staff members at the secondary level; and
- 6. Two (2) parents of secondary age students."

While the board policy stipulates that the committee members shall meet the above descriptions, it does not further designate that the members shall have certain specific "academic credentials." However, in response to the complainant's request for such credentials of the committee members, the Communications Department is providing information below about the members, where applicable, including degrees earned, teaching and administrative experience, etc.
