**Subject:** Read- Ahead, June 19, 2018 Work Session, Inset Attendance Zones

Board Members,

As you know, we have some time on your June 19, 2018 Work Session agenda to discuss Inset Attendance Zones, specifically the elementary attendance zones that serve north Sarasota. Several of you have asked questions about these attendance zones from a number of perspectives. This work session is intended to give you an opportunity to publicly discuss these zones

From a staff perspective we're hoping that this work session is the first of several conversations regarding this topic. Rather than ask staff to spend a lot of energy producing data that may or may not be helpful, we see this first meeting as a dialog to learn more about your concerns and to get direction. Once we better understand what you may be trying to accomplish we can produce and provide more information.

Having said that, to get the conversation started we are providing two categorical pieces of information. First, at Tab 1 is information regarding school capacity, enrollment, inset zone populations, and where the students in the inset zones are actually attending school. The first page of the Tab is a map showing the attendance zones. The second page is a summary of the attendance patterns for each school with an inset area. The remainder of Tab 1 is a by-school snapshot of capacity, enrollment, and inset zone attendance patterns. For each school we've included a summary of where the students who live in each inset area attend school (if other than their districted inset) and a map indicating the students living in the inset, by the school they are actually attending. Please note that an individual dot may represent more than one student.


Tab 2 is intended to give you some general visibility into the Transportation component of the discussion. The first page of this Tab includes a summary of all of the inset zone routes. Routes are sorted by school and show the size of the load, length of the route, and number of stops. As you review this data understand two nuances. First, load size represents the number of "eligible riders," not necessarily the number of students who actually get on the bus. Second, route length is based on an electronic estimate of route time. Things like traffic and even season can impact the actual route length. The remainder of Tab 2 are the actual route sheets for each of the summarized routes. We've also included a somewhat crude map of each route, indicating stop locations.

Finally, at Tab 3 are three court documents we hope put the conversation into a historic context. The first document is an order from the Federal Court stating that the District achieved unitary status. The remaining two documents are the Motion to Dismiss filed by the Defendant (the Board) and the Position of the Plaintiff. Note that the Position of the Plaintiff includes a statement that reads, in part, "Defendant Board has met its constitutional duty to disestablish its former dual system in a prompt, honorable and responsible fashion that might well serve as a model for other Boards seeking to comply with federal court mandates."







FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Court upon consideration of the file. This case is an illuminating one in the area of school desegregation. The defendant Sarasota County Board of Public Instruction has consistently made efforts to comply with decisions of the Supreme Court of the United States and with orders of this court. A unitary school system has been in effect in Sarasota County at least since September, 1970. The Court previously indicated that it would consider a motion to end its jurisdiction and to dismiss this case by order entered June 29, 1970. Such a motion was filed on December 4, 1970, but the Court denied the motion in order that the plan adopted by the defendant school board could be evaluated in practice. By order entered August 23, 1971, the Court directed the parties to submit memoranda relative to whether or not this action should be dismissed.

The plaintiffs responded to the Court's order, agreeing to a dismissal of this action. The efforts of the defendants during the pendency of this action have been commendable. Plaintiffs' response to the August 23, 1971, order places proper prospective upon defendants' handling of this case:

"Defendant Board has met its constitutional duty to disestablish its former dual school system in a prompt, honorable and responsible fashion that might well serve as a model for other boards seeking to comply with federal court mandates."

The Court agrees with this conclusion. Vestiges of state imposed segregation have been removed from the operation of the public school system in Sarasota County. There is no evidence countering the conclusion that the unitary school system now established in Sarasota County has stabilized.

Difficulties encountered by other school systems in establishing a unitary system of public education might well have been avoided if the cooperative and responsible attitude displayed by the defendants in this action had been adopted. The Court agrees with plaintiffs and defendants that this action should be dismissed. Swann v. Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education, 91 S.Ct.1267(1971); Green v. County School Board of New Kent County, 391 U.S.430 (1968).

The Court commands the actions and attitudes of all parties to this action and their respective counsel. Whereupon, it is  
ORDERED and ADJUDGED;

Upon the Court's own motion and upon agreement of the parties, this action is hereby dismissed.



Now come Plaintiffs, by and through their undersigned attorneys, and say to the Court that they have no objection to the dismissal of the above-entitled cause by September 20, 1971. In support of their position Plaintiffs would say as follows:

1. Defendant Board of Public Instruction appeared to have, by September 1970, already established a unitary, non-racial school system in Sarasota County, Florida;
2. In order to determine accurately the extent to which the unitary system in Sarasota represented a stable situation, this Court decided to postpone considering dismissal of the action until after the 1970-71 academic year;
3. Plaintiffs are aware of no evidence - documentary, statistical or testimonial - that indicates any impermissible alteration in the unitary system established as of 1970 in Sarasota County;
4. Defendant Board has met its constitutional duty to disestablish its former dual school system in

a prompt, honorable and responsible fashion that might well serve as a model for other boards seeking to comply with federal court mandates.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, Plaintiffs respectfully agree to the dismissal of this school desegregation case by September 20, 1971.

MOTION TO DISMISS

Defendants move the Court to dismiss this action on the ground that Plaintiffs have shown no right to further relief for the reasons set forth herein:

1. The Orders of this Court of April 7, 1967 and January 29, 1970 respecting a desegregation plan for Sarasota County's public schools have been complied with since February 6, 1970, and the Board's certificate of compliance has been filed with the Court.
2. The Defendant Board of Public Instruction of Sarasota County filed its Amended Plan of Desegregation May 27, 1970 and after a hearing held June 29, 1970 the Court entered its Order approving the Amended Desegregation Plan with regard to the Booker-Bay Haven project and the Osprey Elementary School; this Order of the Court has been complied with and in all other respects the Defendant School Board has been in continual compliance with Orders of this Court. Statistical summaries are appended which show the present numbers of white and black students and faculty in each school.
3. The Court has retained jurisdiction for a reasonable time (since February 6, 1970) after the Defendant's school system became a unitary one to insure that the system is operated

in a constitutional manner and that it is clear that the state imposed segregation has been completely removed.

4. This Motion is made pursuant to the provisions of the Court's Order of June 29, 1970.
