## Bay Haven Basics Plus

## 1. Project description

As Sarasota is considered the "Circus Capital of the World" this multi-discipline project will introduce the historical and modern circus to elementary students at Bay Haven Basics Plus through field trips, in class circus arts workshops and school wide performances during a family circus themed event. Our historic school building was built in the same era as the Ringling Museum, and is the elementary school closest to the Museum...we have many historical connections. Many of our children have never visited the Museum, the circus or participated in some aspect of performance arts. Objectives:

- Students will learn about the history of the circus in Europe and America
- Students will learn about Sarasota's famous citizen John Ringling and the Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey Circus "The Greatest Show on Earth".
- Students will visit the Circus Museum, and the Tibbal's Learning Center at The John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art. Features include the world's largest miniature circus, circus artifacts, circus wagons, posters and hands-on activities.
- Students will learn about the math and science involved in the circus...centrifugal force, inertia, friction, physics, gravity, arc, angle, load, weights, balance and numbers. Highly supportive of FCAT!
- Fourth and Fifth grade students will learn performance skills such as pantomime, scarf juggling, balance acts, basic clowning and other simple yet fun circus performance arts. These will be lifelong skills.
- Students will perform for the entire school with parents and community members invited to be in the audience. Fulfills our School Improvement Plan.

The <u>specific activities</u> will include virtual and live time field trips for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades to the Ringling Circus Museums. Circus Sarasota will be invited to do in-class circus arts workshops. Students will learn about the science and math of the circus in Science classes. They will learn balance and juggling acts in PE. They will learn about and create Circus Posters, costuming and mime in art classes. They will learn about famous circus music and perform circus music in music class. They will learn about famous circus acts and performers from Hispanic countries in Spanish class. Specials teachers will coordinate with the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers to create a unit of instruction that can be replicated in the future. Students will have a culminating performance for the entire school during a "Bay Haven Bright Spot by the Bay Circus Day" in the spring.

2. This project is important to students because it will address all curriculum areas in practical real life ways.

Our <u>School Improvement Plan</u> focuses on <u>Reading</u> across the content areas, improving <u>Science</u> and <u>Math</u> FCAT scores. These planned activities specifically address all of these areas. Current data shows there is a strong need for students in all sub groups to understand math and science in real life context, and to have students interests stimulated enough to want to read, conduct research and apply what they have learned.

- 3. Student learning will be assessed by the following methods:
  - Observation checklists
  - Field Trip feedback by parents, teachers and students and Museum staff
  - Student created costumes and projects in Art Class
  - Student performance on instruments in Music Class
  - Student participation with science experiments featuring circus physics in Science
  - Improved scores in ongoing assessments and for FCAT
  - Student participation in balance beam, juggling and various circus skills in P.E.
  - Student performances for the school and community
- 4. The results of this project will be shared at a school wide "Circus Day" which will feature student performances. Parents, press and community members will also be invited. A written report will be shared with the Ringling Museum Circus Education staff and with the District Social Studies curriculum coordinator.
