Overall, is there a strict age policy or is it based on coursework and/or tests?

Also, given Sarasota's emphasis on the arts within the school system (dedicated VPA gifted programs at Booker Middle and Booker High and several magnet schools), I'm surprised and disappointed that applied arts courses are specifically excluded from articulation agreement.

I have been very disappointed that my freshman, age 15, son who attends Sarasota High School AICE and MAST doesn't have access to dual enrollment though he did score what he needed on ACT to qualify as a freshman in high school. I would like to know why he can't access DE/early enrollment as my daughter did. She took DE classes at SMA and this is how she was able to obtain the AA before her actual high school graduation date (the same week as her SCF graduation). I would like my son to have same AA opportunity and don't understand why SHS doesn't have access for him at least as a sophomore.

I think dual enrollment is an amazing program and I know USF now provides it too. I am happy to give positive testimony about this program.
