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DEFINITION OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

An individual who is not subject to the control and direction of the employer for whom work is being performed, with respect not only to what shall be done but to how it shall be done. If the employer has the right to exert such control, an employee-employer relationship exists and the person is an employee and not an independent contractor. The following factors are guidelines to aid in determining whether an individual is an employee or an

An independent contractor hires, supervises, and pays assistants under a contract that requires him/her to provide materials and labor and to be

An independent contractor is the master of his/her own time and works on his/her own schedule. An independent contractor can work when and for

An independent contractor is paid periodically (usually a percent of the total payment) by the job or on a straight commission. An independent contractor

An independent contractor has a significant investment in the facilities he/she uses in performing services for someone else.

An independent contractor can make a profit or suffer loss. Profit or loss implies the use of capital by the individual in an independent business

An independent contractor provides his/her services to two or more unrelated persons or firms at the same time.

An independent contractor makes his/her services available to the general public. This can be done in a number of ways. Having his/her own office and assistants, hanging out a "shingle", holding business licenses, having listings in business directories and telephone directories, and advertising in

An independent contractor cannot be terminated so long as he/she produces a result that meets the specifications of the contract. An independent contractor can be terminated but usually he/she will be entitled to damages or expenses incurred, lost profit, etc.

An independent contractor usually agrees to a complete a specific job and is responsible for its satisfactory completion, or is legally obligated to make
