Sarasota STEM Charter School Application- Natalie Roca	 On August 1, 2017 the district received the Sarasota STEM charter application The school will be a Science Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Academy for K- 8 students The proposed plan is to open in 2018-19 with an enrollment of 714 VPK – Grade 6 students in year one, adding grades 7 and 8 in subsequent years to reach a projected enrollment of 890 students by year 5 The school will be located at 930 N. Beneva Road in Sarasota County The applicant proposes to use an Educational Service Provider (ESP), Alliance Educational Services, Inc., to provide comprehensive education services, HR services and business management services to the school The district Charter Review Committee (CRC) used the Florida <i>Charter School Application Evaluation Instrument</i> to evaluate the application for compliance with state statutes and its evidence of meeting standards necessary for the operation of a high quality charter school. Ratings are divided into three standards – Educational Plan, Organizational Plan and Business Plan The preliminary total summary rating was as follows: 26% Meets; 48% Partially Meets; 26% Does Not Meet

	 Board Members discussed the strengths and weaknesses of the application with the representatives. On October 10, 2017 the applicant will have the opportunity to participate in the CRC Capacity Interview to answer any additional questions The School Board will take action to approve or deny the application at the November 7, 2017 School Board meeting

The utilization challenges and opportunities of a medical center were discussed A summary of expenses was shared/discussed; it is projected the District could save \$1.2 - \$2.0 million per year in claims expenses Sarasota County Schools rate history was reviewed from 2009 to present An updated financial analysis was discussed in detail
